Caleb's team (Mattice, Watkins, Southall, Mattice) place 7th in the handicap division; Caleb placed 27th in the handicap singles division; and 6th place in the handicap all events earning \$160.00 in scholarship funds in the Virginia State tournament. He is excited because this money will help him go to college and get a good job!



Dylan Perdue is 12 years old. He is in the 7th grade and is attending Spotsylvania Middle School. He first started bowling in 2012 and plans to continue for a long time. He loves that he can have fun and make new friends. His favorite pro bowler is Pete Weber! Dylan and his family come and practice a lot at the alley. His dad

He earned \$485.00 in scholarship funds! He is happy to help out his parents so they will not have to pay a lot to get him into a college. He plans to continue to bowl in tournaments to add to his scholarship funds. He was a little nervous before this tournament but was able to take deep breaths to calm himself so he was able to perform at his best. tournament was 724. Excellent performance and it showed in the results. Pete's team won 1st place handicap team (Ellis, Mann, Oliver, Brown); 1st place handicap doubles (Oliver, Brown); 2nd place in the handicap all events; 9th place in the scratch all events; 4th place in team scratch; 4th place in scratch doubles; and 21st in handicap Singles! He is grateful that he will be able to assist in paying for some of his college and not all of the funds have to come out of his dad's pocket. Pete continues to improve his game. 
