

2013 GFUSBCA Hall of Famer for Bowler Achievement

PAUL L. RUMBAUGH II

Paul L. Rumbaugh II was born on August 22, 1959 in Kittanning, PA to Paul L. and Linda A. (Harty) Rumbaugh. He grew up in cascade, MD and graduated from Smithsburg High School, Smithsburg, MD. He received a B.S. in Wildlife Management from West Virginia University, Morgantown, WV and a M.S.A. from Central Michigan University. He served 21 years in the U.S. Air Force in a variety of positions within the Intercontinental Ballistic Missile career field before retiring to Stafford, VA. He currently is a senior analyst with a defense contractor. He is married to the former Cynthia Eyler of Waynesboro, PA.

Paul started bowling at Fort Ritchie Lanes, Fort Ritchie, MD where his father was a mechanic and later the manager. He bowled there a few years in the bantam leagues before giving up the sport until college. He picked up the sport again in college bowling in several leagues a week by his senior year. He took another break from the sport until joining the U.S. Air Force and being assigned to Minot AFB, ND in 1987. He began league bowling in earnest and was a member of the base bowling team for three years.

After three years at Vandenberg AFB, CA bowling in multiple leagues, he moved to Randolph AFB in San Antonio, TX. His passion soon turned into an obsession as he bowled in six leagues a week, anchored the base bowling team and bowled tournaments almost every weekend. It culminate with him being selected the San Antonio Bowling Association's Bowler of the Year 1997-1998. Paul rolled his first 300 game in 1997 at Randolph AFB only to roll another one two nights later downtown. It was while in San Antonio that Paul made the first of three All Air Force teams.

After moving to Omaha, NE in 1998, Paul bowled in four leagues at Offutt AFB, NE; Omaha, NE and Council Bluffs, IA. In 2000-2001, Paul received the Greater Omaha Metro Bowling Association's Award of Merit for having the highest league average in the Association with a 232. In February 2001, Paul was the runner-up at Air Force Championships held at Tinker AFB, OK.

Paul arrived in the Fredericksburg, VA in 2001 and hasn't slowed down. He continues to bowl in three leagues a week in three different houses and tournaments all over the area on weekends. In June 2005, he set the VA state record with an 879 series bowling at Liberty Lanes Stafford. He served as President of the GFUSBC from 2007-2011. In seven GFUSBC Open tournaments, he has 11 scratch titles. In April 2013, Paul won the Nation's Capital Association Tournament All Events Scratch Event. Most recently, he rolled a 300 in May 2013 at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, NV during the USBC Open Championships. Paul has 34 career 300 games and 19 career 800 series.

2013 GFUSBCA Hall of Famer for Meritorious Service

DEBORAH JOHNSON

For Deborah Johnson, bowling has been a part of her life for almost six decades. Deborah started her bowling career in 1955 when she joined her first youth league as a Junior bowler. After bowling in the youth divisions for several years, Deborah joined her first adult league at the age of nineteen when she replaced one of the bowlers on her mother's team. In 1968, she started bowling fulltime only missing significant time due to duty station transfers or pregnancy. Along with bowling, Johnson has been involved to support the success of bowling in the Fredericksburg area.

On April 18, 1999, Johnson was in attendance for the organizational meeting of the Fredericksburg Area Women's Bowling Association (FAWBA). Early in the spring of 2000, she was promoted to Vice President. In July of that year, she became the FAWBA

Secretary, an office she would maintain until 2005. During her tenure with FAWBA, Deborah served as the Tournament Director for all FAWBA tournaments. In December 2004, she was also integral to the disbanding of FAWBA to allow for a USBC Merged Association to be formed, which was finalized after the local American Bowlers Congress members approved.

Following the merger on July 9, 2005, an organized charter meeting was held, which was organized by Deborah. She was also heavily involved with recruiting members for the charter committee. By August 11th, the bylaws for the newly formed association had been approved, officers had been elected, and the USBC Charter had been approved officially forming the GFUSBC. Johnson initially served as a Temporary Association Manager, and by September she had been granted the position. During her tenure as Association Manager, she was a delegate to the USBC convention to represent the newly formed local association. Her other accomplishments include the Tournament Director for all GFUSBC tournaments, including the annual Senior, Women's, and Open tournaments.

In August 2008, Johnson submitted her resignation from her officer's position with the anticipation of moving out of state. However, due to changes with the economy and the housing market, coupled with her granddaughter moving in with her during her senior year of high school the move did not come to fruition. Despite no longer holding her position, she still remains active with the GFUSBCA, even recommending current GFUSBCA Director Skip Frey to her previous position after tendering her resignation.

Meet Our New 2nd Vice President Bryan Gallahan


