From the Association Manager...

I am very pleased to report our membership continues to increase and exceed our estimate for budget purposes. Membership totals for the end of January were 2,276 which represent 1,995 adults and 281 youth.

New Association Phone Number

Replacement Cards

If you are requesting a replacement card, please indicate if the request is to replace a lost or missing card or if the request is due to your card stating "N/A" for average. It is important that you relay the proper information, as there are different steps to insure you received an accurate card. A replacement for a card that states "no average" is much more complicated than simply requesting a replacement. "No average" cards must be researched as to why the average is not stated and in some cases need Association Manager's verification of average for USBC to override the "N/A".

Tournaments

The 1st Annual Senior Tournament was conducted in January and from all reports was a big hit. Hopefully next year we can see more Men's Doubles entries. All prize checks have been distributed to the indicated Entry Captain. If you have not received your expected prize check, please contact your Captain or the Association office. First Place trophies are expected to be received approximately February 17. Every attempt will be made to make formal presentations during the champions' league play.

Entries for the 1st Annual Women's Championship closed January 22, and at the time of this writing the first week of competition has been completed. With \$2,500 added prize monies from the former Fredericksburg Area WBA, the number of entries received was a disappointment compared to previous year totals for the Women's City Tournament. While entry blanks were out later than expected, I am still amazed at how many women have indicated they did not know about the tournament. Every attempt was made to publicize the tournament with information in the last newsletter, and event flyers distributed to every league and center. In addition, all league secretaries were supplied with entry forms to be distributed within their leagues.

Entry forms for the 1st Annual Open Championship tournament are available at all area centers and on the web at <u>www.gfusbca.org</u> with an entry deadline of February 22. The tournament will run March 4th & 5th and March 11th & 12th at AMF Fredericksburg. This tournament is open to all adult GFUSBC members. Teams are comprised of four persons. Both Team and Doubles can be comprised of either gender. The tournament offers something for everyone with both handicap and optional scratch events in all categories. Entry into the optional Team Scratch event requires the entire team be registered for the optional event; likewise for Doubles – both partners must select the optional scratch event. All Events for both handicap and scratch require entry into all associated events for that category. Don't be left out of this exciting tournament. Get your entries in early and secure your requested date. Remember, the prize fund and places paid is totally dependent on the number of entries – so, encourage others to experience the excitement of tournament play.

Annual Meeting

The first GFUSBC Annual meeting will be held May 6^{th} – the location and time is still to be determined and will be communicated via flyers and league secretaries.

League Workshop

The Greater Fredericksburg USBC has opted to conduct one area-wide league workshop for league officers to be held August 12^{th} at the Chancellor Community Center. While area centers may continue to hold individual center meetings for the leagues, the GFUSBC workshop will be the vehicle for disseminating information to the league officers and distributing league certification packages. All league Secretaries and Presidents should plan to attend. The plan is to make the workshop both informative and fun! The workshop will enable us to provide information to all leagues at one meeting – ensuring everyone gets the same information and help they need and deserve. Leagues are encouraged to elect their officers at the end of this winter season so the appropriate persons can attend the workshop – secretaries will be required to submit the names and addresses of the elected officers for the 06-07 winter season.

Youth Scholarships

Did you know that GFUSBC offers a \$250 scholarship to a qualifying youth male and female? Requests were sent to all area Youth Directors for a listing of graduating seniors with response from only one. Applications sent to qualifying seniors produced no response by the deadline.

The Virginia State Youth Association offers the Blake Harrison Memorial Scholarship Fund to qualifying seniors - applications have been distributed to all league Youth Directors – deadline for application is March 15h. The Bowler's Edge

Frank Grant of the AMF Pro Shop offers the following advice to help us determine how the oil has been applied across the lane.

This hint can help the novice as well as more advanced bowlers to improve their game by knowing the lanes.

Begin by lining up as you normally would, making sure your feet are positioned on the approach at your precise starting point. Select your normal target, which might be an arrow, dot or break point down the lanes. Roll you ball over this mark and note where the ball strikes the pins. Repeat this process using a target to the right of your mark and again with a target to the left of your preferred mark. You will notice your ball breaks more over one mark and less over the other, giving you a different finish at the pins. More turn (break) indicates a dryer surface at that point on the lane and, conversely, less would indicate more oil. This information can help you determine what lane area of play will provide an edge in obtaining better results for your individual style of play.
