

Aim your push away at your lane target

As you start the ball moving in your approach, make sure that the ball moves in a straight line toward your target on the lane. This will help prevent your swing from going off line. Let the rest of your swing be relaxed and keep it in a straight line toward your target.

Starting a relaxed swing

Using too much muscle will pull your swing off line and make it difficult to be consistent. In addition, using muscle causes the swing to feel restricted, which actually slows it down. A relaxed swing starts in the stance by keeping your grip relaxed. The hand and arm muscles need to feel relaxed. To develop this feel, try this drill from the USBC Athlete Development Drills package.

- 1. Get into a comfortable stance position holding the ball about waist high.
- 2. Move your ball-side foot back more than usual to have additional balance.
- 3. Squeeze the ball as hard as possible and hold it for seven to 10 seconds.
- 4. You should feel the tension in your hand, arm and shoulder.

Relax your grip and feel the difference. When ready to bowl, make sure your arm and hand are relaxed before you start your approach.

RULES YOU MIGHT NOT KNOW

You have bowled a few frames in a league or a tournament and think you need to dull your ball to adapt to the conditions. **CAN YOU?**

USBC Playing Rule 18 provides the answer.

Altering the surface of a bowling ball by the use of abrasives while bowling in USBC competition (tournament or league) is prohibited. Any ball altered must be removed from competition. Competition begins when <u>ANY</u> player delivers the first ball for score. The little known part is that <u>you may not alter the surface between the doubles and singles events</u> even if that ball is in your bag and has not been used in play. Further, this action can lead to dismissal from league and suspension of USBC membership.

You may clean a ball at any time using approved cleaning agents. These agents are listed on bowl.com

GOOD THINGS TO KNOW



Storm Watch

After a bad storm, all but two teams were able to field legal lineups. Are these two teams entitled to emergency postponements when all the other teams in the league were able to get to the lanes?

Yes, weather conditions which prevent a team from fielding a legal lineup are classified as emergencies. Leagues must grant postponements for emergencies when a team fails to appear for its scheduled match due to reasons beyond its control. Adverse weather conditions are sufficient reason to grant a postponement without advance notice.

Members must realize all bowlers do not face the same driving conditions or circumstances, so the inability of an individual to drive under adverse conditions cannot be used as a basis for declaring games forfeited.



In September, I mentioned the negative feedback I had received concerning the timeliness of bowlers receiving their awards and the steps I had instituted to speed up the process in the 2008-2009 season. Please remember that these prestigious awards cannot be reported to USBC until all paper work has been properly filled out.
