# Gena Gunn Provides a Great Moment for **Our Association this Summer**



Members of the Tuesday Mixed Summer League at AMF witnessed history when Gena Gunn rolled the first 300 game by a woman in our association on August 21st, the last day of the summer season. This is also the first honor score by a woman going back to the Fredericksburg Area Women's Bowling Association (FAWBA)

that existed before the merger of men and women bowlers into the GFUSBC. Gena is a Technical Recruiter for BAE Systems and started bowling in 1997, has a high average of 187 and bowled a 719 set. She participates on several leagues in the area and rolled her first 300 at Shirley Bowl in February of this year. Gena is a member of the team that won the TCBA Traveling Ladies League last year and went to Houston, Texas to compete in the Championship Tournament. She also enjoys playing softball when there is time. Gena hit a homerun this summer.

# Youth Bowlers get the Gold in Buffalo !

(Some of the following came from a story by Kurt Nicoll of the Free Lance-Star)

Thirty six Fredericksburg GFUSBC youth traveled to Buffalo, New York in July to compete in the first ever USBC Youth National Tournament and compete they did. There were over 2,000 participants in this tournament, some from as far away as France and Bermuda. The Fredericksburg team of Amy Spence, Daniel Yeagley, Chelsea Mills and Joshua Myles called their team "Syrupy Pancakes" were entered in Division IV (519 team average and under) and they poured it on rolling a combined score of 1,728 to place FIRST. The kids weren't finished there. David Armstrong almost matched the team first place honors, bowling a 499 set that placed him second in his singles event (129 and under average) losing by only two pins. David rolled doubles with Mathew Hager (combined 259 and under) and they placed ninth. Davids hot bowling also earned him all events honors. Many of the other youth also placed well in the standings. This was a tremendous showing by area youth. (A complete story of the trip is on page 5)

Closer to home, 13 year old Teresa Chada of Bumbass won FIRST in the Coventry Commonwealth Games held in Christiansburg. She bowled a 180, 156 and 137 to qualify as the top seed in her category. Then she bowled a 142 game to win top honors.

# **Paul Rumbaugh**



Hello and welcome back for the 2007-2008 fall/winter season. It's hard to believe summer is almost over and the kids are back in school.

Let me introduce myself. My name is Paul Rumbaugh and I'm honored to be your new Greater Fredericksburg United States Bowling Congress (GFUSBC) president for the next two years. I was born in Pennsylvania and grew up near Hagerstown, MD. I graduated from Smithsburg High School in Smithsburg, MD. I first started bowling in a youth league at Fort Ritchie, MD. My father was the head mechanic and later manager of the post six-lane house and later a new 12-lane house.

I attended West Virginia University where I received a B.S. in Wildlife Resources and then enlisted in the U.S. Air Force. After not bowling for several years, I picked the game back up bowling in multiple leagues while in college. I also completed a Masters of Science degree in Administration from Central Michigan University.

I served in the Air Force for 21 years in positions including aircraft maintenance, ICBM missile launch officer, evaluator, instructor, staff officer, and missile targeting. My final assignment was at Fort Belvoir in the Defense Threat Reduction Agency as a START Treaty monitor doing six-week tours in Russia. My wife Cindy and I have lived and bowled in Georgia, North Dakota, California, Texas, and Nebraska before moving to Stafford in 2001. Currently, I work for McNeil Technologies, Inc., a defense contractor. We've made many friends all over the country through bowling. Whenever we moved to a new location, the bowling center was always one of our first stops. It was while stationed at Minot AFB, ND that I started bowling more seriously.

My bowling accomplishments include 18-300 games, 7-800 series, and a personal high of 879, setting the VA state record in 2005. I bowled on the Air Force team for three years and was runner-up at Air Force Championships in 2000. I received Bowler of the Year honors from the San Antonio Bowling Association in 1997-1998. During the 2000-2001 season, I received the award of merit for having the highest league average in the Greater Omaha Metropolitan Bowling Association of 232.

Even though I don't have any experience serving on local or state bowling organizations, good people surround me on our board. I want to thank Bobby Phillips for his leadership during the first two years of this organization. He and the volunteers on the board did much work getting the GFUSBC organized and merging the men, women, and youth organizations. There is still plenty of work ahead as we move forward. I would like to see our organization grow from the 37 winter leagues, 13 summer leagues, and 2,600 adult and youth members. I also would like to see our local "city" tournaments grow and maybe even double the entries. There is no reason why that can't happen. One of my chief complaints and of many others I've spoken with is the same – the prize fund is too small. That's because of a lack of entries. We have enough league bowlers, but not enough tournament bowlers. We need the league team captains to enter their teams in the association tournaments.

We also need more of our members to get involved with association activities. If you want to volunteer to help us out, please contact one of our board members or me. Again welcome back to the fall/winter season. Good luck and high scores. I'll see you on the lanes.

#### The Bowlers Edge

(Bowl.com and USBC Coaching provide these tips)

- 1. Aim your push away at your target. As you start the ball moving in the approach, make sure that the ball moves in a straight line toward the lane target. This will help prevent your swing from going off line. Let the rest of your swing be relaxed and maintain the straight swing aimed at the target.
- 2. Short first step in your approach will allow you to maintain good balance. Each successive step will be slightly longer to build momentum to the finish position

The Spotsylvania Fire Department Station 4 also welcomed the youth's with blaring sirens and flashing emergency lights. A banner strung across the front of the center said it all, "Welcome Home USBC Youth Champions". On board, were Amy Spence and Daniel Yeagley, two members of the 2007 Youth National Division IV Champion Team "Syrupy Pancakes". The other two teammates, Chelsea Mills and Joshua Myles, rode with their parents. In addition to the 1<sup>st</sup> place team award, youth bowler David Armstrong finished second in both the singles event, as well as, all events. We had numerous bowlers finish within the top 100 in their events, with several in the top 25!

In Buffalo the entire group was treated to numerous events. Trip coordinators Brenda Chambers and Randy Lewis made sure that we had plenty to do. On Friday following the team event, everyone returned to the hotel for a huge pizza party. Sixteen large pizzas and around 300 chicken wings were ordered from a local restaurant and everyone was able to eat and reflect on the day. # From the Association Manager ....

Welcome back! Hope everyone had a wonderful summer and are ready to get back into the swing of the winter season.

Please remember when filling out your 07-08 membership cards to verify all pre-printed information and make any necessary changes. Printing clearly is extremely important. If I misread your information, it could delay the delivery of your certification cards. USBC Headquarters in using emails to communicate directly with their members – please print your email addresses clearly.

#### A Recap of Season Changes...

- Averages will no longer be printed on your membership cards. Evidently there was a problem with reporting the highest average for some people who held dual membership in two or more associations. Even though there was a disclaimer to always verify your average, some persons were using the pre-printed average for tournaments without verification.
- ≥ 298 and 299 Games will be treated as 11-in-a-Row for Standard Ten Pin. USBC will no longer issue rings for 298 & 299 honor scores 11-in-a-Row plaques will be awarded. Members, who qualify, may purchase a ring if desired. (Sport scores of 299 will continue to receive a 299 plaque).
- > Sport Upgrade has increased. The cost of an upgrade to Sport bowling is now \$15 for adults and \$10 for Youth.
- FUSBC Award Changes. There have been criteria changes for three awards are:
  - o 100-124 Game 75 Average and below
  - o 125-149 Game 95 Average and below
  - o 175-199 Game 145 Average and below

#### **New Awards:**

- o 300-349 Series 95 Average or below
- o 350-399 Series 110 Average or below

League secretaries using league software must update their local award criteria and add the new awards. The new award criteria is available on the GFUSBC website at <a href="https://www.gfusbca.org">www.gfusbca.org</a>

➤ <u>GFUSBC Tournaments</u>. The board will consider limiting the Open and Women's tournaments to one weekend unless the number of entries requires additional squad times. This will eliminate excessively small squads.

## **Keyboard Functions**

## **Bowler Changes**

Push the Qubica Key on the side the <u>bowler's</u> name is on:

#### **SUBSTITUTE**

- Select **S** for substitute, then select the number of the bowler you are replacing.
- > Start typing the name of the substitute bowler and if the bowler is in this league, it will find the correct person.
- > Push the red button to confirm the information
- ➤ Do not use modify bowler as this only modifies the information and does not import the scores for the sub it puts the scores to the original bowler.

#### **NEW BOWLER**

- ➤ Select **R** for remove bowler, then select the number of which bowler to remove.
- > Press the red key.
- Press the Qubica key and select N for adding a new bowler.
- Enter the bowler's name and hit the right arrow twice to put in a handicap.
- > Press the red key.

#### ABSENTEE BOWLER (BLIND)

- Select **B** for blind.
- ➤ Enter the bowler number of the absentee bowler.
- Insert the score to be used
- Press the red button.

# **LATE BOWLER** (After an absentee has already been entered)

- Select **B** for blind.
- Enter the bowler's number.
- > Use the left arrow key to erase the score.
- > Push the red button.

#### LINEUP ORDER CHANGE

- Select **L** for lineup.
- > Press two numbers of team members to switch
- > Repeat until the order is correct.
- Push the red button.
- > Only two bowlers can be changed at a time.

#### **SKIP BOWLER\***

- Select **K** for skip.
- Enter bowler number a skip will appear in front of the name.
- Press the red button.

#### **UN-SKIP BOWLER**

- ➤ Select **K** for skip
- ➤ Enter bowler number the skip will disappear in front of the name.
- Press the red button.

\*Note: If a bowler is still in the skip mode at the end of a game, the scoring system will not proceed to the next game until it is removed and an absent or bowers score is inserted or bowled.

#### **Score Corrections**

From the side the bowler is currently on.

#### **CORRECT SCORE**

- ➤ Push the **Correct Score** button
- The last ball thrown will start flashing
- > Use the arrow keys to get to the incorrect frame
- Enter the new value
- > Push the red button

#### **REMOVE FRAME**

- Push the **Remove Frame** button (to remove the last ball thrown)
- > Push the red button

#### ADD FRAME

- > Push the **Add Frame** button to add a score
- Select the **number, X, or /** to insert a score (one ball at a time, for current bowler)
- Push the red button

#### **RE-SCAN SCORE**

- ➤ On the first ball (non-strike), if the camera reads incorrectly from late pin fall
- ➤ Press the **Re-Scan Score** button on the side that the bowler is bowling on.
- > Push the red button
